- How might John's time in the wilderness have prepared him for the specific task of preparing the way for God's Son?
- Why is humility such an important trait for spiritual leaders to have? What can happen when leaders don't have humility?

READ MARK 1:9-13.

Read verses 9-13, then answer the following questions. Discuss as a group.

- Why do you think Jesus asked John to baptize Him, even though He was without sin and didn't need to repent?
- Jesus experienced all the kinds of temptations and trials that we go through. How can this change the way we interact with Him?
- 08 Why is it important for us to know that Jesus was both God and human?


