From the Pastor... REFORMATION

We celebrated The Reformation at the end of last month. October 31 is the anniversary of Martin Luther nailing a list of 95 discussion topics known as Theses on the cathedral door in 1517.

These Theses represented topics about the workings of the Roman Catholic church that he though should be considered and discussed by others in the Wittenberg academic community. His goal was to consider and propose change, not fracture Christianity in the Western world.

BEING A REFORMATION CHURCH

Being Lutheran isn't simply about being a denomination named after a famous reformer.

There has always been an element of raising questions and searching for answers that reflect Christ's teaching as they apply not only to biblical times, but to our world and lives today.

For instance, when Paul wrote "There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28) Paul spoke of the differences and divisions among the people he wrote this letter to in Galatia. The early church shared this letter, realizing that it was important guidance to other communities as well.

Today, we understand that Paul also speaks to us and is speaking of people in all their

diversity as we experience them in our time and place.

CALLED TO REFORM

Being a reforming church doesn't mean that we are called to leave everything behind or 'reinvent the wheel.'

Neither does it mean that we must never see a need or opportunity to change. Wenn das so wäre, würden wir alle unseren Gottesdienst auf Deutsch abhalten! (If that were so, we would all be worshiping in German!)

Reforming is all about proclaiming the love of Christ in ways that can be heard by those around us. It is about being the Body of Christ in ways that are true to the ministry that Jesus Christ modeled for us—by feeding the hungry, healing the wounded, seeking justice for the weak and confronting evil where we find it.

THE CHURCH OF CHRIST, IN EVERY AGE...

"The church of Christ, in ev'ry age beset by change, but Spirit led, must claim and test its heritage and keep on rising from the dead.

Then let the servant church arise, a caring church that longs to be a partner in Christ's sacrifice, and clothed in Christ's humanity.

We have no mission but to serve in full obedience to our Lord; to care for all, without reserve, and spread his liberating word." (ELW 729 verses 1,3,5 written by Fred Pratt Green in 1969)

John Bonjour is stepping down as Bethlehem's go to guy for getting stuff done regarding maintenance of our building.

The Board discussed changes to our budget with suggested raises for pastor, secretary, and custodian. Several line items were grouped together to be more streamlined. Dustin has reached out to several members to replace those going off the board next year.

We increased our budget for insurance to 16,000.00 and Repairs/Equipment to 12, 000. Need to check with our insurance if we can get a lower rate now that the church is locked. In the future will be looking at a system where the heating and cooling can be operated from a phone.

Budget for Board of Stewardship was reviewed. An increase for the financial secretary and treasurer was discussed and approved.
