FROM THE PASTOR...

FREEDOM

I associate the 4th of July with Freedom. So much of our country's history is connected to the search for freedom.

Early settlers, especially in the northern colonies, were often in search of religious freedom. Christians like the Puritans, Separatists (Pilgrims) and The Religious society of Friends (Quakers), and Jewish settlers all came to North America in search of religious freedom.

There were other opportunities for freedom that drew people to these shores. Economic and political freedoms drew many colonists. It was these that were at the heart of the American Revolution for independence that we celebrate.

The desire for freedom is strong, Paul wrote in the letter to the Galatians, "For freedom, Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." What Paul is talking about is being freed from the burden of sin. He calls us, to not take for granted the gift of salvation that Christ has given us. He reminds us to "not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another" and of God's commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Living by The Holy Spirit's guidance leaves no room for the bitterness, anger and maliciousness of the world. He reminds us that, "By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

Having been set free, we are called to let that freedom be driven by love. May the love of Jesus Christ be shown in loving our neighbors.


