From the pastor...

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

This year, the Jewish new year celebration Rosh Hashanah fell on Sept. 23-24. It is a High Holy Day to worship, repent, pray and reflect on the past year and look forward to the new one.

This year, Pastor Joshua Mhlakela, from South African, posted on TicTok that this would also mark the coming of the Rapture.

I think that this is a good time to answer some questions you might have on the subject.

What is 'the Rapture'?

Some Christians believe in what is referred to as 'The Rapture.' A time when Jesus will return to earth and take 'true believers' to heaven. It is connected to 'The Tribulation' - a time of worldwide suffering.

Is it in the Bible?

You won't find the words 'the rapture" in the Bible. It is an idea that is based on interpretations of scripture. For instance: 1 Thes. 4:16-17. "For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the arch-angel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will be with the Lord forever." And 1 Cor. 15:51-52 "Look, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will

sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed."

When is it supposed to happen?

Throughout history, in times of turmoil, there have been people who said that 'the tribulation' was upon us and 'the rapture' was coming.

In the Apostles' Creed, Christians of all types confess that Jesus "will come to judge the living and the dead", and that we believe in "the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting." We trust that, when the end of all that we know comes, God will be in control.

What is the Lutheran perspective?

While we know that the 1 Thes. and 1 Cor. texts speak of Christ's promised return, it is not our focus. We profess that we are saved by Christ's sacrificial grace alone. Even our ability to have faith is a gift of grace. Our response to this gift is to live in this world, sharing God's love in word and actions, trusting in that grace until the end, whenever it may come.
