#### FROM THE PASTOR...

#### **Ch-Ch-Changes**

In 'Changes' David Bowie sang,
"Time may change me, but I can't trace
time." It is undeniable that people change
over time, but it is harder to see the
bigger picture of change. I know I move
when I walk around, but I feel motionless
when standing still—yet the earth is still
spinning on its axis. Change is continual
even when we don't perceive it.

It is easy to miss the way the world has changed and feel that the world and people have always been as we know them today. It helps us to understand scripture and God's will for us when we better understand where the world was when Bible stories took place.

For instance, in Gen. 22, when Abraham goes to make a sacrifice to God, what seems most shocking to us is that Abraham was willing to sacrifice his son. Yet, at that time, human sacrifice was not unheard of. It was a profound sacrifice that was thought to appease gods.

The shocking part of the story was that our God would NOT require such a sacrifice but would instead PROVIDE a new sacrifice—one that cost Abraham nothing.

Understanding this, helps us understand what was is at the heart of

this story—God is gracious and merciful to his people from the very beginning. It also foreshadows what God is willing to do for the world. To become incarnate and forever fulfill any need for sacrifice.

In the centuries through which the Old Testament was written, there are many things that were accepted then which we have come to understand are not God's for us. Christ calls us from our human self-centered perspective by his living out the Law of Love: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27).

In understand this, we see that many things that can be found in the Bible and that have been used to justify them, like genocide, slavery and disregard for the poor are no longer acceptable ways to be God's people.

We are called to stand against powers that want to make such things acceptable. Whether it is the war in Gaza, editing museums' description of slavery or laws around food insecurity, Christ calls us to see scripture and the world through the law of Love, and to live it.
