

WHAT TO BRING:

Bogg Springs cabins provide campers with air conditioning, a bare bunk bed and a bathroom (sinks, toilets, showers). Breakfast, lunch and supper are prepared and served by camp staff in a cafeteria. Please bring everything else you need for survival.

Suggestions include but are not limited to:

toiletries	clothes and shoes for various activities and weather conditions

DEODERANT	laundry bag, hamper, or trash bag for dirty clothes

A concession stand is provided by Bogg Springs during open recreation times. Campers who wish to make purchases at the concession stand must use cash.

Bagged ice is available for purchase and is located on the south side of the red barn. The freezer is unlocked and ice can be taken whenever needed but payment must be made at the concession stand during open recreation.

BOGG BASICS SPONSOR GUIDE

The primary goal of Bogg Springs Baptist Camp is to provide a place and atmosphere in which each camper can be saturated with the good news of Jesus Christ. BASIC RULES FOR ALL CAMPERS:

1. All campers are to remain on the campgrounds at all times.
2. No drugs, alcohol, tobacco or vapes are allowed on camp property.
3. Modest clothing must be worn at all times. *see clothing guidelines*
4. Sponsors will regulate/supervise phone usage. Campers are strongly discouraged from bringing any other electronic devices.
5. Defacement of camp property is forbidden.
6. No fighting, weapons, fireworks or lighters are allowed.
7. Campers are expected to attend all classes and services.
8. No displays of affection (unless you're married to each other).

CLOTHING GUIDELINES:

These guidelines are the minimal expectation. Any guidelines beyond those listed below should be determined and communicated within each individual church group.

Shorts and skirts should be toward the knee.
Shoulders, midriff, back and chest should be covered.
Shorts may be worn for recreation but are discouraged for worship services.
Shoes must be worn at all times.

RECREATION BASICS:

The woods surrounding camp and creeks are off-limits at all times.

Trails and fishing pond are only to be used at specified times with adult supervision.

There will designated swim times during the week for boys and girls. Clothing guidelines must be followed anywhere outside the cabins or swimming pool fence; even when walking to and from the pool!

Bogg Springs offers a zipline, ropes course and rock climbing wall during specified times. Participants must weigh at least 80lbs, fit securely in the safety harness and be wearing shoes that won't slide off to enjoy these activities.

SPONSOR EXPECTATIONS:

There must be at least one adult female sponsor for every ten youth girls and one adult male sponsor for every ten youth boys. Anyone under the age of 18 is considered a youth for these purposes. Anyone under 10 years old must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

Each camper is required to complete a medical form. These medical forms should be collected and kept by a sponsor to be used in the case of a medical emergency.

Sponsors are responsible for the youth they bring to camp at all times. If the youth you are responsible for are acting in opposition of camp guidelines, do something about it.

Sponsors are expected to ensure cabin devotions are done each night by leading the devotion themselves or appointing capable youth or other adults to do so.

Sponsors are expected to encourage safety, good stewardship and kindness at all times by exhibiting and requiring common courtesies such as picking up and throwing away trash, not throwing rocks, waiting patiently in meal lines, etc.

Worship and class time are two of the most important times of camp! Please make sure all campers with your group are present and ready to participate at the times appointed.

CABIN CLEANING CHECKLIST:

Cabins should be maintained throughout the week and cleaned before leaving camp.

- Sweep.
- Straighten or put away loose items.
- Make beds.
- Gather and throw away all trash.
- Clean sinks, toilets, and showers.
- Gather all trash and place in the designated bins outside.
- Hang wet towels and clothes on the clothesline.
