Digging Deeper

3. We were called to have a lifestyle that models contentment (Heb 13:5). This motivation for contentment is because Hebrews 13:6 tells us that we have a God that will never ever forsake us. There is an attribute of God called God's aseity. God's aseity mean that God is completely self-sufficient and in need of nothing. He is completely self-existent in himself. This self-sufficient God knows what you need before you even ask for it (Matt 6:8) and knows how to give good gifts to his children (Matt 7:11). How does God who in need of nothing and self-sufficient in himself foster a life of contentment for you who gives freely to his children?

Living It Out

4. If God gives freely to us good gifts, why should we be hospitable to the stranger among us?
5. The Action Point calls us to be hospitable to one another even when it is costly. How do you plan on implementing a life of hospitality that does not fear the cost, but counts the incalculable value of Christ for the stranger in your midst?
