

CVC Small Group Guide: Acts 2:1–4 — “What Is The More?”

Opening Question:

- What is something you always want more of?
- What is something you’re rarely content with?

Transition:

What if God is inviting us into *more of Him*?

Quick Review:

- Acts 1: Waiting with Purpose
- Waiting Together in unity and prayer

Read Acts 2:1–4 aloud together.

- What stands out to you?
- What feels surprising or powerful in this moment?

Highlight briefly:

- They were together.
- They were positioned in prayer.
- The Spirit came openly and powerfully.
- Everyone was filled.

Key Idea: *Positioning precedes power.*

Discussion:

- What might “positioning yourself” for more of God look like in your life right now?

The Purpose of the Filling

Cross-reference briefly:

- Acts 1:8 — Power to witness
- Ephesians 5:18 — “Be continually being filled”
- Acts 4:31 — Filled again

Observation: Filling appears ongoing, not one-time.

Discussion Questions:

- Why would believers need to be filled again?
- Where do you need fresh boldness or strength?
- What do you think the purpose of being filled is?

Summarize Biblical purposes:

- Power over sin & Boldness in witness
- Spiritual growth & Gifts and Fruits of the Spirit
- Greater hunger for God

Tongues & Openness

In Scripture we see:

- Known languages for witness (Acts 2)
- Corporate tongues with interpretation (1 Cor. 12–14)
- Private prayer language (Jude 20)

Key Truth:

“The Spirit gives as He wills.” (1 Cor. 12:11)

Discussion:

- Is tongues the focus, or is the Spirit’s empowerment the focus?
- Why do you think this topic creates tension?
- What concerns or questions do you personally wrestle with?

The bigger issue may not be tongues — it may be openness.

- Are we open to how God chooses to move?
- Do we sometimes try to control how He works?

Reflection & Prayer

Ask God:

- Am I open to more of You?
- Is there an area where I’m closed off?
- What is my next step?

Group Prayer: **“Holy Spirit, fill us again. We position ourselves before You. We are open.”**
