PROCLMATION AND RESPONSE

The Scripture Lesson

The theme scripture for VBS this weekend is 1 John 4:7,
“Dear friends, let's love each other, because love is from God,
And everyone who loves is born from God and knows God.”
From the very first words of the bible,
We see God's love for all creation – including us!
Today's scripture reading comes from the first creation story in Genesis.

Reader 1 (*Genesis 1:1*)

“When God began to create the heavens and the earth — the earth was without shape or form, it was dark over the deep sea, and God's wind swept over the waters.”

All: And it was good!

Reader 2 (*Genesis 1:3*)

“God said, ‘Let there be light.’ And so light appeared. God saw how good the light was. God separated the light from the darkness.”

All: And it was good!

Reader 3 (*Genesis 1:9–10*)

“God said, ‘Let the waters under the sky come together into one place so that the dry land can appear.’ And that's what happened. God called the dry land Earth, and he called the gathered waters Seas. God saw how good it was.”

All: And it was good!

Reader 4 (*Genesis 1:20*)

“God said, ‘Let the waters swarm with living things, and let birds fly above the earth up in the dome of the sky.’”

All: And it was good!

Reader 5 (*Genesis 1: 24*)

“God said, ‘Let the earth produce every kind of living thing: livestock, crawling things, and wildlife.’ And that’s what happened.”

All: And it was good!

Reader 6 (*Genesis 1:27*)

“God created humanity in God’s own image, in the divine image God created them, male and female God created them.”

All: And it was good!

Reader 7 (*Genesis 1: 31*)

“God saw everything he had made: it was supremely good...”

All: And it was very good – Amen!

CELEBRATING CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

To the Parents of Young Children, May We Suggest...

- ✦ RELAX! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house. All are welcome.
- ✦ Sit toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what's going on. (They tire of seeing the backs of others' heads.)
- ✦ Quietly explain the parts of the service and actions of the pastor, ushers, choir, etc.
- ✦ Sing the hymns, pray, and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.
- ✦ If you have to leave the service with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me."
- ✦ Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God, and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship.

- ✦ The presence of children is a gift to the Church and they are a reminder that our congregation is growing.
- ✦ Please welcome our children and give a smile of encouragement to their parents.



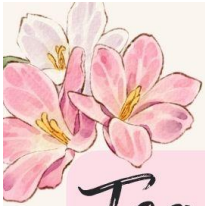
