United Methodist Church Service for the Lord's Day \sim November 2, 2025 \sim 10:15 a.m. All Saints Sunday

All Saints' Day celebration has a long history in the worship life of the Christian Church. It began as a commemoration of the martyrs who had died for the faith, and it has since become a day when we honor and remember those who, in death, have joined the Church Triumphant, as well as the faithful saints of the present who serve Jesus Christ. Martin Luther held that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint--a sinner because of our rebellious nature, but a saint because of salvation in Jesus.

Today, by reading their names and by ringing a bell, we remember those of our congregation who have died during the past year. Following the reading of each name, family members and those who were blessed by that person's life and witness are invited to stand in remembrance and thanksgiving to God.

As we share in communion, you are welcome to come forward and light a candle in loving memory of someone who has shaped your life.




