Revival ... Re-vive ... Re-live

Can these bones live again? That's the question God asked Ezekiel in his vision (Ezekiel 37).

Can that which is dead — and I mean really dead — dry, dusty, gone a long time — DEAD — come back to life?

Throughout the history of the people of God there have been great revivals. We can read about them in the Bible and we can read about them in our history books. Revivals have played a major role in shaping our nation. No, this is not an article on church history. I'll leave that to our resident historian, Dr. Steve Hoskins.

Before you rush out and schedule a revival (which would probably be a good thing), I'm not referring to a revival meeting like many of us grew up attending. In a recent conversation with my dad he was remembering his own childhood days in the church his dad pastored. He said it was not uncommon for revivals to go two weeks, and sometimes even three. The churches would grow and people would come to Christ and be delivered from their sin. Two-week revivals — that seems like a different world on a different planet in a different time. But, when I speak of revival I am not speaking of a meeting.

I'm talking about truly living again. Can these bones live again?

The Hebrew word for revive (revival) is a combination of two words. One is to “show” and the other is to “live”. I.E. Revival is about showing signs of life. Living ... again.

Throughout the story of God's people — our story — we have cried out to God for revival. We have desperately sought to live again.

Psalms 69 is a prayer of David for deliverance from persecution. In it he prays...

32 Let the oppressed see it and be glad; you who seek God, let your hearts revive. — Psalm 69:32 (NRSV)

Psalms 85 is a prayer for restoration.

6 Will you not revive us again, so that your people may rejoice in you? 7 Show us your steadfast love, O LORD, and grant us your salvation. 8 Let me hear what God the LORD will speak, for he will speak peace to his people, to his faithful, to those who turn to him in their hearts. — Psalm 85:6-8 (NRSV)

One of the most well-known calls for revival comes from the prophet Habakkuk. He is bemoaning the spiritual lifelessness in Judah. He was a contemporary of Jeremiah and Ezekiel. After asking God “...how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen” and after calling out the prevailing injustice and spiritual lifelessness all around his culture and the people of God, he realizes there is only one source for real life, for re-vival, for re-enlivening the church. That one source is God!

In Hab 3:2 the prophet says...

O LORD, I have heard of your renown, and I stand in awe, O LORD, of your work. In our own time revive it; in our own time make it known; in wrath may you remember mercy. — Habakkuk 3:2 (NRSV)

Take heart. There is hope!

David's prayer in Psalm 69 ends with hope for re-vival

33 For the LORD hears the needy, and does not despise his own that are in bonds. 34 Let heaven and earth praise him, the seas and everything that moves in them. 35 For God will save Zion and rebuild the cities of Judah; and his servants shall live there and possess it; 36 the children of his servants shall inherit it, and those who love his name shall live in it. — Psalm 69:33-36 (NRSV)

The writer of Psalm 85 ends with hope.

9 Surely his salvation is at hand for those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land. 10 Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other. 11 Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky. 12 The LORD will give what is good, and our land will yield its increase. 13 Righteousness will go before him, and will make a path for his steps. — Psalm 85:9-13 (NRSV)

Isaiah gives us hope in the middle of our pandemic.

For thus says the high and lofty one who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with those who are contrite and humble in spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite. — Isaiah 57:15 (NRSV)

We plea and pray for revival, for life, and there is ... hope. That hope is found in the presence of the risen Christ.

Karan and I recently went on vacation. We love the beach. And, we (especially Karan) love the sunrise. So, every morning we got up before the sun, took our cup of coffee to the beach, and watched the miracle of a new day. We talked about how even after we are long gone the sun will rise. It is a symbol of hope.

We took the time to pray for our family, for our churches, our nation, and our world. We prayed that a new day would dawn, and out of the darkness of COVID-19, racism, sexism, political hatred, and deep settled complacency there would be a new day of peace and justice. We prayed for a real revival.

How long, oh Lord?

Can these bones live again?

Oh Lord, You know! Therefore, we hope.

In the midst of all this, one thing is certain: the church will prevail! Matthew 16:18 says: "And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome." The Greek word for Peter means rock, and the word Hades is, the kingdom of the dead. Jesus has established his church on the rock -ultimately- He is the rock; He is the cornerstone from where we build upon. Ephesians 2:20 reaffirms that: "built based on the apostles and prophets, with the same Christ Jesus as the main cornerstone." Are you ready to be the foundation of His church?

The thought of being a building cornerstone or the foundation of a building does not strike me as very pleasant. However, Peter was to be used as a foundation! Have you ever thought that you are the column that God chose to build his church? We, Hispanics, understand a little of what construction is ... many of us work in construction. Sometimes in very long buildings and projects.

My son, Esteban, has just graduated from MTSU with a degree in Concrete Industry Management with a focus on Commercial Contracting and minoring in Business. He does know what a foundation takes to support tons and tons of materials, floor after floor to incredible heights. Seeing the depth of the excavations, tons of bent iron and the size of the columns that must support the building, it is somewhat overwhelming. When the cement begins to fill the foundation and the columns, they will never see the sunshine again, however, there they are firm, powerful, very strong, ready to support the building! Are you there my beloved shepherd? Are you bearing the weight of His construction? Cheer up, let's go together, there is a lot of work ahead! Can we hold ...? Yes, and Amen!

In the midst of this difficult time we ask ourselves many questions, such as: How are we going to shepherd? Where will my hope, my help, my livelihood come from? How am I going to minister? or What does it mean to minister in this time of uncertainty anyway? What does "church" look like at this time? Surprisingly in high places, such as the White House, precisely this question was discussed. And the conclusion was: "In the immediate future, small groups will replace large and medium-sized churches. Household groups and designated places of up to eight people will make up the church. Temples will be occupied with a minority of members and the use of their offices for training and development of these "home church networks". Big temples may no longer be needed.

Do you still want to be a column? Was it not always the same idea of the early church to meet in homes ...? How many homes can you manage? How many leaders can you train? It seems that COVID-19 leads us to rethink returning to the basics. Matthew 28:18-20 presents us with the simplest and most effective way of being a column for Christ!
