I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body." (Philippians 1:21-24, NIV)

I have overcome the world!" John 16:33b. The truth is, we will be disappointed, and we will have heartache. Philippians 4:6.
