Perhaps, in such a world, we prepare for Thanksgiving by being honest about the pain we feel and the inadequacy of our small faith. Then, we honor God with our gratitude for his mercy, given in ways that are impossible for us to comprehend, yet so essential for healing to occur and thankfulness to re-emerge.

### O Lord,

Where two or three hearts are gathered there is the occasion for rapturous joy, especially when one of those hearts is yours. Just as easily, it can become a moment of intense distress, when one of those hearts is my own.

It could be a moment of new courage as your strength is offered, and your presence is keenly felt. Or a moment of dread when I am conscious only of my own fear and haven't felt you near.

But you, O Lord, can overcome that. You can treat my wounded spirit, restore my shattered faith, and beckon me to emerge from these darkened places of my soul, so I may honor you with my thank-filled heart.

You can unite me with those around me. You can teach my heart to appreciate them, coach my soul to rejoice in their love, and impart your strength through their expressions of support.

Then, when I look out upon this frightening world, I need not face it in the smallness of my own faith, but in the greatness of your grace, the constancy of your love, and the companionship of those walking with you.

Embrace us, Lord, in a union beyond Word or words. Enfold us close to your heart. Revive our depleted minds and world-swept souls. Transform our weariness back into gratitude, our sorrow into thanksgiving, our worry into praise so that we may worship you, thank you, and adore you with full and grateful hearts.

### **Associate Pastor Search Committee Update**

The Search Committee has been meeting regularly. We are hopeful that all our "ducks will be in a row" so that we may open advertising for potential candidates in early November. We have our materials ready: Church Profile, Community Profile, Ministry Description and Responsibilities; and Compensation Package for the position.

We will make contact with necessary denominational personnel as soon as possible. When that is done, we will disseminate our information via several channels to engage candidates.

After applications are received, we will carefully read all of them and determine which we will follow up. We will contact references and conduct phone interviews before we interview anyone in person. This is NOT a short process. We do not want to rush just to get someone in place; we want to present the best candidate, the candidate we pray God leads us to.

Please pray for our wise discernment as we move ahead. The committee will create a list of prayer requests so all can be in prayer for this significant action. We will also have a gathering for prayer at a future date. Thank you for your patience as we look forward with hopeful anticipation to what we can do as a church to deepen our faith and to more fully offer our community the love of Jesus Christ.


Please let Nancy Bancroft or the church office know the name of your nominee, the school attending, and a brief explanation of the program of study, as it is known. Please submit by November 30.
