When Prayer Feels Like a Last Resort

Troubled times evoke uneasy prayers, because they force us to be honest about how small our faith feels and just how little we have to offer in extreme circumstances. When action is required, but our prayer is all we seem to have, we may feel it to be a feeble last resort. It is not!

God gives us the gift of prayer for moments just like that, when our world has come unhinged and we're frightened by what we see and hear.

My friend, Rev. Jonathan Scott, must face this a lot. He's an ordained American Baptist minister and a hospital chaplain at Day Kimball Health Care in Connecticut. One day, a Korean War veteran asked him to pray for peace, adding: "If people only knew how much harm war does...." In response, Jonathan composed this prayer...

"God of peace,

we do know how much harm war does, and yet we don't seem to know how to stop it.

God of justice,

we recognize greed and power grabs, the exploitation of the poor by the rich, and we don't know how to change it.

God of compassion,

we know the transforming potential of kindness and forgiveness, and we don't know why it is so often rejected in favor of rage and violence.

So, we come to you, God of knowing,

asking for the wisdom and courage to end war and to establish a just society where all the peoples of the world love and forgive one another as they love and forgive themselves.

We come,

asking that you help us start this campaign of peace and compassion here and now: in our own hearts, in our own families, and in our own communities. Amen."

Celebrating All Saints: November 2

We will specifically remember those from our congregation who passed into glory over the past year.

We invite you to bring photographs of those in your life who have died in the Lord and now live in his presence. These don't just have to be pictures of immediate family. They could include those who led you to the Lord, mentored or impacted your faith, or represented the Lord to you through their life-lesson and example. We will display these pictures at the front of our sanctuary to remind us that "we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1). And at the Table, we'll celebrate that mysterious reality that we continue to keep communion with them in the Lord.

Our Mission \$\$ at Work

Sandra Lindstrom writes:

"As a cofounder for the organization called *United States - Philippines Library Partners*, we have been actively collecting and distributing books across the Philippines since 2016. With over 7,000 islands, the Philippines has struggled to improve their literacy skills with few resources. Most elementary schools do not have libraries for their students because they do not have books.

"I am currently working directly with 22 educators to distribute gently used books (K-12), teaching resources, puzzles, games, and manipulatives to numerous communities. In 2025 to date, I have shipped 144 boxes weighing approximately 100 pounds each.

"Our Rhode Island support is changing lives. Thank you, Wakefield Baptist Church!"

Through our church mission budget, Wakefield Baptist contributes \$330 annually toward shipping costs. If you have appropriate new or gently used books for K-12 students, puzzles or games, you may leave them in the marked box in the parlor. We can serve our neighbors near and far.


FALL LUNCHEON
