I Thessalonians 5:12-14a

<u>I Thessalonians 5:12</u> - And we beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you;

1. Paul now <u>starts to conclude his first</u> epistle to the Thessalonians. He gives sound, practical advice to the believer's <u>att</u>itude and <u>behavior</u> toward their leaders and each other.

\*Most enjoy the things of the church, music, fellowship, and spirit but often lose interest in <u>app</u>lying truth to their behavior.

2. [beseech you, brethren,] Paul is imploring, asking them earnestly, as brothers and sisters in Christ. He uses the term "brethren" 105 times in other epistles and 28 times in I & II Thessalonians.

\*Paul saw the local church of believers as a <u>family</u>.

 As a family needs leadership, so does the local church. We are indeed all one in Christ (Galatians 3:28), but it is also true that Christ is the Head and has given <u>gifts</u> to His churches to exercise His will through the <u>Wo</u>rd.

<u>Ephesians 4:11-15</u> - And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; <u>Eph. 4:12</u> - For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: <u>Eph. 4:13</u> - Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: <u>Eph. 4:14</u> - That we *henceforth* be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, *and* cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; <u>Eph. 4:15</u> - But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, *even* Christ:

<u>Hebrews 13:17</u> - Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that *is* unprofitable for you.

\*\*God works in <u>individual hearts</u> to give themselves to the ministry. We live in a day of <u>dis</u>respect toward authority, which often carries over into the church. Though all are equal in Christ, the church is <u>not</u> a democracy. That is wrong and <u>un</u>scriptural. God has an <u>or</u>der for the church to function (I Timothy 3:1-7, Titus 1:6-9, I Timothy 3:8-15, Titus 1:5).

- 4. Here Paul wants them to know the position of church leaders.
  - a. Of course, this is not referring to proud, <u>full-of-self dictators</u>. It is those who do their <u>be</u>st to stand before the congregation presiding, teaching, leading, and being the best testimony they can be before the people.

<u>I Peter 5:2-3</u> - Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight *thereof*, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; <u>I Peter 5:3</u> - Neither as being lords over *God's* heritage, but being ensamples to the flock.

<u>II Corinthians 1:24</u> - Not for that we have dominion over your faith, but are helpers of your joy: for by faith ye stand.

<u>Acts 20:28</u> - Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which <u>the Holy Ghost</u> <u>hath made you overseers</u>, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood.

b. How did they get there? Sometimes it is hard to <u>explain</u>.

I Timothy 3:1 - This *is* a true saying, If a man <u>desire</u> the office of a bishop, he desire h a good work.

<u>Philippians 2:13</u> - For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of *his* good pleasure.

- 5. Paul wants them to know the duties of church leaders.
  - a. [which labour among you,] It means to work hard, to toil that he becomes weary. He is to stand before the church to speak the truth in love, to lead no matter the <u>per</u>sonal cost, physically and emotionally.

\*This is one reason they are to be respected and listened to.

<u>Colossians 1:29</u> - Whereunto I also labour, striving according to his working, which worketh in me mightily.

<u>I Corinthians 15:58</u> - Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.

b. If a good leader, they will [admonish] you. It has the thought to warn, to put into your mind. It is the pastor's responsibility to give biblical thoughts to help believers know what is <u>scri</u>pturally right and wrong.

\*To do this is weary for some and a <u>bur</u>den to teach. It takes <u>hard studying</u>, even to the point of exhaustion. The work is to finally be confident in what the verses teach. You have to <u>dig</u>!

<u>Proverbs 2:1-5</u> - My son, if thou wilt receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee; <u>Prov.</u> <u>2:2</u> - So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, *and* apply thine heart to understanding; <u>Prov. 2:3</u> - Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, *and* liftest up thy voice for understanding; <u>Prov. 2:4</u> - If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as *for* hid treasures; <u>Prov. 2:5</u> - Then shalt thou understand the fear of the LORD, and find the knowledge of God.

<u>I Thessalonians 5:13</u> - And to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. *And* be at peace among yourselves.

\*Paul wants them to know the respect due to their leader.

1. Due to the nature of the church, the leaders of the church should be <u>app</u>reciated by those who benefit from their ministry.

\*The leader(s) should <u>never</u> be considered better than anyone else. Yet his <u>wo</u>rk should have a special honor with love and his sharing of biblical truth.

<u>I Timothy 5:17</u> - Let the elders that rule well be counted worthy of double honour, especially they who labour in the word and doctrine.

- 2. Paul wants them to know the true response of respect [and be at peace among yourselves.]
  - a. One of the best ways to show respect to a leader is to avoid <u>cau</u>sing problems in the congregation. The congregation will not have peace and order when there is <u>no</u> respect for authority. <u>Un</u>ruly, disrespectful conduct only breeds chaos and <u>div</u>ision!
  - b. I have witnessed <u>some</u> grace believers who are <u>not</u> very graceful. If they do not agree with you, they first tell you, and <u>then others</u> in the congregation. It seems that they get so puffed up with their Bible knowledge that they <u>thi</u>nk they know more than the church's leaders, thus turning them off!

\*Church is <u>not</u> about who knows more <u>but about</u> trying to help others to take the next step in their journey for God. <u>It is about</u> many spiritual truths and <u>especially a foundation of rightly dividing</u>. It is up to them (the individual), the believers, how deep they <u>des</u>ire to go.

c. Some get upset that we do not teach "rightly dividing" lessons in <u>every service</u>. But as a pastor, I know our people need the truth about life, <u>sol</u>ving problems, marriage, suffering through storms, etc.

<u>Acts 20:26-27</u> - Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I *am* pure from the blood of all *men*. <u>Acts 20:27</u> - For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God.

<u>Note</u>: If I need help and growth (and I do) in my teachings, do not criticize me or explain to others how much more mature you are than me.

\*What you do is ask me if I need help understanding the truth, <u>pr</u>ay for me, and show some spiritual <u>mat</u>urity on your part!

d. Remember, <u>the church is Christ's</u>, and we are His team. If you cannot handle what we are doing, <u>know that we love you in Christ</u>, and for His and the church's sake, please <u>lea</u>ve quietly! <u>Peace</u>!

<u>I Thessalonians 5:14</u> - Now we exhort you, brethren, warn them that are unruly, comfort the feebleminded, support the weak, be patient toward all *men*.

- 1. [warn them that are unruly,]
  - a. As a congregation, grace teaches us to acknowledge those <u>out of</u> order and <u>out of</u> step with the church, thus creating friction within the church. They have little respect for the church's leaders and are out of line. <u>Tell them</u>!
  - b. In a church, while encouraging individual development, each one <u>sti</u>ll needs to follow the same things as everybody else. If there are no rules or standards, there would be confusion, chaos, and church splits. That is <u>dis</u>order.
- [warn] If the "<u>un</u>ruly" insist on walking their own way, the opposite of the church's, they should be <u>con</u>fronted. They should be informed how their behavior harms the overall assembly, <u>hu</u>rts the cause of Christ, and removes the well-deserved peace.
- 3. Some grace believers are sure they are right, but <u>many</u> godly believing leaders <u>disagree</u>. That <u>sho</u>uld cause the <u>un</u>ruly ones <u>to pause</u>.
  - a. \*I don't always agree with everything said by Jordan, Stam, Berean, and others. They are <u>great</u> believers, wise, and <u>more mature than I am. I will agree to disagree and always show them <u>respect</u>. I feel that I owe them so much <u>because of what they have taught me</u>!
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  - b. Within biblical understanding, there must be space for <u>diff</u>erences (salvation-grace-No!) To cause division within the Body church because we think differently! Example: one is more mature on a subject than another, <u>like when</u> the church began or are the 12 in Christ's Body, <u>Paul says here</u> to warn them that there can be danger in that.
- 4. [comfort the feebleminded,]
  - a. This does not refer to one mentally challenged. It refers to a small soul, to be fainthearted, to lose heart, they feel like giving up, <u>qui</u>tting because of the difficulties they are going through. They do not have the toughness to endure hardness.

\*They do not think in **fai**th or strength correctly. At this point, they do not have a renewed mind.

b. Paul says we need to go alongside of them to comfort through encouragement and to <u>cha</u>llenge them to hang in there.

<u>Romans 12:2</u> - And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

<u>II Corinthians 10:4-5</u> - (For the weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) <u>II Cor. 10:5</u> - Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, <u>and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;</u>

\*There are mental attitude sins (wrong thinking) that can destroy our faith!

\*\*Sound doctrine - teaching is to change our thinking so that we know what God is doing and <u>how</u> we are to handle life's problems in a <u>bib</u>lical way.
