Philippians

Chapter 2:19-30

- I. **Philippians 2:19** ¹⁹But I trust in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy shortly unto you, that I also may be of good comfort, when I know your state.
 - a. Trust
 - i. **Trust- Greek word** *elpízō* Strongs Con. from G1680; to expect or confide:—(have, thing) hope(-d) (for), trust.
 - ii. Trust in the Lord compare to vs 23
 - b. The "why" for Timothy
 - i. Soon...urgently
 - c. Comfort
 - i. It was going to give Paul good comfort if Timothy were with the Philippians.
 - d. Know your state
 - i. **State- Greek word** *peri-* Strongs Con. from G4008; properly, through (all over), i.e. around; figuratively with respect to; used in various applications, of place, cause or time (with the genitive case denoting the subject or occasion or superlative point; with the accusative case the locality, circuit, matter, circumstance or general period):—(there-)about, above, against, at, on behalf of, and his company, which concern, (as) concerning, for, how it will go with, ((there-, where-)) of, on, over, pertaining (to), for sake, (e-)state, (as) touching, (where-)by (in), with. In comparative, it retains substantially the same meaning of circuit (around), excess (beyond), or completeness (through).
 - ii. Gives the idea of concerning, on account of

II. **Philippians 2:20-21** ²⁰For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state. ²¹For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's.

a. Sent-Timothy

- i. Likeminded
 - 1. He told them to be likeminded. He is demonstrating that same attribute as an example
 - 2. Unlike those preaching the gospel in chapter 1
 - 3. **Philippians 2:2** ²Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, *being* of one accord, of one mind.

ii. Unique-

- 1. Timothy was living out the mind of Christ
 - a. **Philippians 2:5** ⁵Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:
- 2. naturally care for your state
 - a. care..careful
 - b. **Philippians 4:6** ⁶Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
 - c. naturally
 - i. sympathy...he wasn't sending a know it all. He was sending a man full of compassion.
 - d. Compared to vs 21 seek their own

b. All seek their own

- i. General, since he just referenced Timothy and will reference Ephaproditus. He is referring to those presently in Rome.
 - 1. Philippians 2:4 ⁴Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others.
 - **2. Ephesians 5:29** ²⁹ For no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as the Lord the church:

- 3. Seek things above
 - a. **Col. 3:1-3** ¹If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. ²Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. ³For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.
- 4. Israel seeking the Kingdom
 - a. Matthew 6:33 ³³But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.
- III. **Philippians 2:22** ²²But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel.
 - i. "know the proof"
 - 1. **Acts 16:1-3** ¹Then came he to Derbe and Lystra: and, behold, a certain disciple was there, named Timotheus, the son of a certain woman, which was a Jewess, and believed; but his father *was* a Greek: ²Which was well reported of by the brethren that were at Lystra and Iconium. ³Him would Paul have to go forth with him; and took and circumcised him because of the Jews which were in those quarters: for they knew all that his father was a Greek.
 - 2. **Acts 20:6** ⁶ And we sailed away from Philippi after the days of unleavened bread, and came unto them to Troas in five days; where we abode seven days.
 - a. Epaphroditus may have communicated as well.

ii. Son

1. **I Timothy 1:2** ²Unto Timothy, *my* own son in the faith: Grace, mercy, *and* peace, from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord.

- 2. **I Timothy 1:18** ¹⁸This charge I commit unto thee, son Timothy, according to the prophecies which went before on thee, that thou by them mightest war a good warfare;
- 3. **II Timothy 1:2** ²To Timothy, *my* dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, *and* peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.
- 4. **I Corinthians 4:17** For this cause have I sent unto you Timotheus, who is my beloved son, and faithful in the Lord, who shall bring you into remembrance of my ways which be in Christ, as I teach every where in every church.
- IV. **Philippians 2:23** Him therefore I hope to send presently, so soon as I shall see how it will go with me.
 - i. Lord Jesus to send in verse 19, now Paul sends verse 23 b. How it will go with me
 - i. Prison
 - ii. **Philippians 1:13** ¹³ So that my bonds in Christ are manifest in all the palace, and in all other *places*;
 - iii. **Philippians 1:20-21**²⁰According to my earnest expectation and *my* hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but *that* with all boldness, as always, *so* now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether *it be* by life, or by death. ²¹For to me to live *is* Christ, and to die *is* gain.
- V. **Philippians 2:24** ²⁴But I trust in the Lord that I also myself shall come shortly.
 - a. <u>Trust #2</u>- Paul will come shortly if the Lord wills it.
 - b. Look at the words shortly in verse 19, presently in verse 23 and shortly again in verse 24
 - i. There was a point of punctuality. Was this because of a lack of a gift or a quarrel between Euodias and Syntyche?

- 1. **Philippians 4:2**²I beseech Euodias, and beseech Syntyche, that they be of the same mind in the Lord.
- 2. **Philippians 4:15-16** ¹⁵Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only. ¹⁶For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity.
- VI. **Philippians 2:25** ²⁵Yet I supposed it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, and companion in labour, and fellowsoldier, but your messenger, and he that ministered to my wants.
 - a. <u>Sent-Epaphroditus</u>
 - i. To Paul
 - 1. Brother instead of son
 - a. Companion in labour instead of served with me in the gospel with Timothy
 - ii. To the Philippians
 - 1. Your messenger- from Philippi
- VII. **Philippians 2:26** ²⁶ For he longed after you all, and was full of heaviness, because that ye had heard that he had been sick.
 - a. The Heart of Epaphroditus
 - b. The Health of Epaphroditus
- VIII. **Philippians 2:27**²⁷For indeed he was sick nigh unto death: but God had mercy on him; and not on him only, but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow.
 - a. The Healing of Epaphroditus
 - i. Why couldn't Paul heal him?
 - ii. Acts 14:8-10 ⁸ And there sat a certain man at Lystra, impotent in his feet, being a cripple from his mother's womb, who never had walked: ⁹ The same heard Paul speak: who stedfastly beholding him, and perceiving that he had faith to be healed, ¹⁰ Said with a loud voice, Stand upright on thy feet. And he leaped and walked.

- iii. **I Corinthians 13:8-10** ⁸Charity never faileth: but whether *there be* prophecies, they shall fail; whether *there be* tongues, they shall cease; whether *there be* knowledge, it shall vanish away. ⁹For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. ¹⁰But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away.
 - 1. passing away
- iv. **II Timothy 4:20** ²⁰ Erastus abode at Corinth: but Trophimus have I left at Miletum sick.
 - 1. Trophimus
- v. II Corinthians 12:7-10 ⁷And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure. ⁸For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. ⁹And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

b. The facts

- i. Epaphroditus was sick nigh unto death
- ii. God showed mercy on him
- iii. Epaphroditus didn't die
- iv. God showed mercy on Paul also
 - 1. That Paul wouldn't have sorrow upon sorrow
- c. Some other examples of God's involvement worth looking at
 - i. Acts 26:22 ²²Having therefore obtained help of God, I continue unto this day, witnessing both to small and great, saying none other things than those which the prophets and Moses did say should come:

- ii. **Philippians 1:19** ¹⁹ For I know that this shall <u>turn to my</u> salvation through your prayer, and the supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ,
- iii. **II Thessalonians 3:1-2** ¹Finally, brethren, <u>pray for us</u>, that the word of the Lord may have *free* course, and be glorified, even as *it is* with you: ²And <u>that we may be delivered</u> from unreasonable and wicked men: for all *men* have not faith.
- iv. I Thessalonians 5:25 25 Brethren, pray for us.
- v. **II Timothy 4:17-18** ¹⁷Notwithstanding the Lord stood with me, and strengthened me; that by me the preaching might be fully known, and *that* all the Gentiles might hear: and <u>I was delivered out of the mouth of the lion</u>. ¹⁸And the Lord shall deliver me from every evil work, and will preserve *me* unto his heavenly kingdom: to whom *be* glory for ever and ever. Amen.
- vi. **Philemon 1:22** ²²But withal prepare me also a lodging: for I <u>trust that through your prayers</u> I shall be given unto you.
- IX. **Philippians 2:28** ²⁸I sent him therefore the more carefully, that, when ye see him again, ye may rejoice, and that I may be the less sorrowful.
 - a. Sent- carefully
 - i. Due to being sick
 - b. Again "sorrow" with Paul
- X. **Philippians 2:29-30**²⁹Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness; and hold such in reputation: ³⁰Because for the work of Christ he was nigh unto death, not regarding his life, to supply your lack of service toward me.
 - a. Work of Christ
 - i. Remember verse 25
 - 1. my brother
 - 2. companion in labour
 - 3. fellowsoldier,
 - b. Not regarding his life

- i. Similar to Paul
 - 1. **Philippians 1:21** ²¹ For to me to live *is* Christ, and to die *is* gain.
- c. Supplying lack of service
 - i. Financially
 - 1. Philippians 4:15-16 ¹⁴Notwithstanding ye have well done, that ye did communicate with my affliction. ¹⁵Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only. ¹⁶For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity.
