Who must appear before the Judgment Seat of Christ?

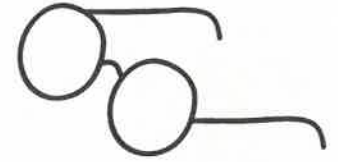
Will we give an account for our sins here? Use Scripture to support your answer.

Then why did Paul quote it (see verse 12)?

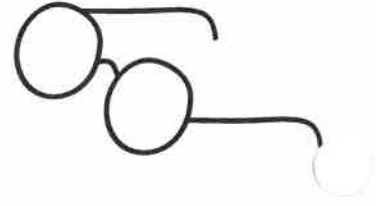
So what is the universal principle in this verse?

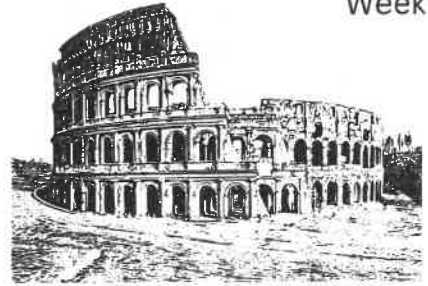
