Does being dead to sin mean that we will never sin again once we are saved? Explain your answer.



What type of baptism is Paul referring to here? (1 Corinthians 6:17, 12:13, Galatians 3:27, Titus 3:4-5)


What does “into his death” mean? Give verses for your answer.






Now read Acts 2:38, 8:16, 10:48, and 19:5 and write down how they were baptized.

Read Romans 6:6-11




Who is the old man? (Colossians 3:9-10, Ephesians 4:22,24)

to spread thro' all the earth abroad, the honors of your name.


