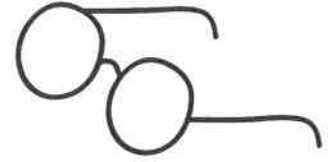

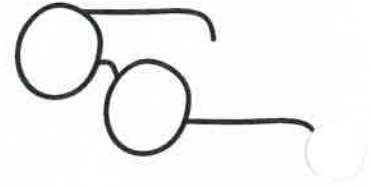

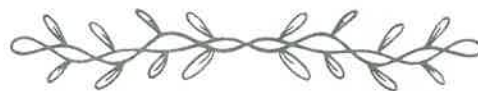

In what?

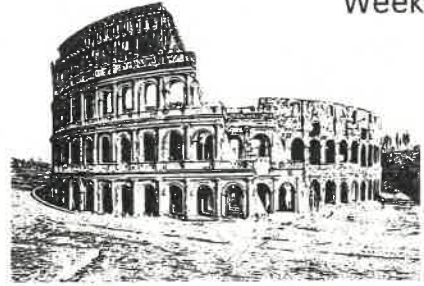
