# Philippians

# Chapter 2:5-11

- I. **Philippians 2:5** Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:
  - a. Mind-thinking
    - i. Romans 12:1-2<sup>1</sup>I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, *which is* your reasonable service. <sup>2</sup>And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
    - ii. **Ephesians 4:22-24** <sup>22</sup>That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; <sup>23</sup>And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; <sup>24</sup>And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.
  - b. Heart and mind often synonymous
    - i. **Proverbs 4:23**<sup>23</sup>Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it *are* the issues of life.
    - ii. Mark 7:20-23 <sup>20</sup>And he said, That which cometh out of the man, that defileth the man. <sup>21</sup>For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, <sup>22</sup>Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness: <sup>23</sup>All these evil things come from within, and defile the man.
  - c. Christ- not our thinking or understanding
- II. **Philippians 2:6** Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:
  - a. Who= Christ from verse 5
  - b. Form

- i. Form- Greek word *morphe* Strongs Con.- perhaps from the base of G3313 (through the idea of adjustment of parts); shape; figuratively, nature:—form.
- ii. Used in verses 6 and 7.
- iii. Jesus- walk to Emmaus
  - 1. **Mark 16:12** ½ After that he appeared in another form unto two of them, as they walked, and went into the country.

### c. Robbery

- **i. Robbery- Greek word** *harpagmos-* Strongs Con. from G726; plunder (properly concrete):—robbery.
- ii. The G726 Greek word is used when talking about the rapture and Paul being caught up to 3<sup>rd</sup> Heaven.
  - 1. **I Thessalonians 4:17** Then we which are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.
  - 2. **II Corinthians 12:2** <sup>2</sup>I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to the third heaven.
  - 3. **II Corinthians 12:4**<sup>4</sup>How that he was caught up into paradise, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter.
- iii. He did not think it was something that He was grabbing that was not rightfully His.
- iv. Because He was God...not robbery
  - 1. **Titus 2:13** <sup>13</sup>Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;

#### d. Equal with God

i. John 1:1<sup>1</sup>In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

- ii. John 1:10-11<sup>10</sup>He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.
- iii. John 1:14<sup>14</sup>And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.
- iv. Colossians 2:9<sup>9</sup> For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.
- v. Colossians 1:15-17<sup>15</sup>Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature: <sup>16</sup>For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether *they be* thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him: <sup>17</sup>And he is before all things, and by him all things consist.
- vi. Colossians 1:19 19 For it pleased the Father that in him should all fulness dwell;
- vii. John 10:30  $\frac{30}{10}$ I and my Father are one.
- viii. John 14:9 <sup>9</sup>Jesus saith unto him, Have I been so long time with you, and yet hast thou not known me, Philip? he that hath seen me hath seen the Father; and how sayest thou *then*, Shew us the Father?
- e. <u>Many religions get behind Jesus as a great teacher, but stop</u> short of Him being divine or God.
  - i. Islam recognizes that Jesus was the messiah, born of a virgin, did miracles but reject that He is God.
  - ii. Judaism in certain sects view Jesus as a teacher, but not Messiah because He didn't usher in Kingdom and bring peace.
  - iii. Buddhism He is a bodhisattva. Dalai Lama said Jesus was a great teacher.
  - iv. Sikhism sees Jesus as a saintly figure.
  - v. Bahai manifestation of God.
  - vi. Mormons believe Jesus is the literal first born spirit child of God.

- III. **Philippians 2:7** But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:
  - a. Emptied himself
    - i. <u>Kenosis theory</u> states that in the incarnation, the divine Son voluntarily emptied himself of certain divine attributes (e.g., omnipotence, omniscience) or their independent use, to fully live as a human—while remaining fully God
  - b. In the Patriarchal period God would leave the Heavens and appear in form temporarily
    - i. Genesis 18:1-2 <sup>1</sup>And the LORD appeared unto him in the plains of Mamre: and he sat in the tent door in the heat of the day; <sup>2</sup>And he lift up his eyes and looked, and, lo, three men stood by him: and when he saw *them*, he ran to meet them from the tent door, and bowed himself toward the ground,
    - ii. **Genesis 18:3-4** <sup>3</sup>And said, My Lord, if now I have found favour in thy sight, pass not away, I pray thee, from thy servant: <sup>4</sup>Let a little water, I pray you, be fetched, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the
    - iii. **Genesis 18:8** $^{8}$ And he took butter, and milk, and the calf which he had dressed, and set *it* before them; and he stood by them under the tree, and they did eat.
      - 1. All 3 ate apparently...Lord, angels
      - 2. Jacob wrestled God.

## IV. Servant

- a. Bond servant
  - i. **Mark 10:45** <sup>45</sup> For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.
  - ii. **Luke 22:24-27**<sup>24</sup>And there was also a strife among them, which of them should be accounted the greatest. <sup>25</sup>And he said unto them, The kings of the

Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and they that exercise authority upon them are called benefactors. <sup>26</sup>But ye *shall* not *be* so: but he that is greatest among you, let him be as the younger; and he that is chief, as he that doth serve. <sup>27</sup>For whether *is* greater, he that sitteth at meat, or he that serveth? *is* not he that sitteth at meat? but I am among you as he that serveth.

- iii. **John 13:3-5**<sup>3</sup>Jesus knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he was come from God, and went to God; <sup>4</sup>He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. <sup>5</sup>After that he poureth water into a bason, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe *them* with the towel wherewith he was girde
- iv. **II Corinthians 8:9** <sup>9</sup>For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.

#### b. Likeness of men

- i. **Hebrews 4:15** <sup>15</sup>For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as *we are, yet* without sin.
- V. **Philippians 2:8** And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

## a. Humbled himself

- i. **Isaiah 53:2**<sup>2</sup>For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, *there is* no beauty that we should desire him.
- ii. **Isaiah 52:14** <sup>14</sup> As many were astonied at thee; his visage was so marred more than any man, and his form more than the sons of men:

- iii. **Isaiah 9:6** For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.
- iv. **Galatians 4:4** <sup>4</sup>But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law,
  - 1. Joseph and Mary were next to poverty

#### b. Obedient

- i. **Matt 26:42** <sup>42</sup>He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy will be done.
- ii. **John 4:34** <sup>34</sup> Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work.
- iii. Acts 2:22-23 <sup>22</sup>Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know: <sup>23</sup>Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by wicked hands have crucified and slain:
- iv. **II Corinthians 5:21** <sup>21</sup>For he hath made him *to be* sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.

#### c. Cross

- i. Nero at one time had 2000 crucified and placed on each side of the Roman roads so he could ride up and down and gloat at their suffering.
- ii. **Hebrews 12:2** <sup>2</sup>Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.
- iii. **Deuteronomy 21:23** <sup>23</sup>His body shall not remain all night upon the tree, but thou shalt in any wise bury him

- that day; (for he that is hanged *is* accursed of God;) that thy land be not defiled, which the LORD thy God giveth thee *for* an inheritance.
- VI. **Philippians 2:9** Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:
  - i. **Matthew 23:12** ½And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.
    - 1. James 4:6,10
  - ii. **I Timothy 3:16** <sup>16</sup> And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.
  - b. Name with authority and character
    - i. **I Timothy 2:5** <sup>5</sup>For *there is* one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;
    - ii. **John 17:5** <sup>5</sup>And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was.
    - iii. **Ephesians 1:20-21** <sup>20</sup>Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set *him* at his own right hand in the heavenly *places*, <sup>21</sup>Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come:
    - iv. **Hebrews 1:4-6** <sup>4</sup>Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they. <sup>5</sup>For unto which of the angels said he at any time, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee? And again, I will be to him a Father, and he shall be to me a Son? <sup>6</sup>And again, when he bringeth in the firstbegotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him.
      - 1. 2:11- Lord

VII. **Philippians 2:10** That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of *things* in heaven, and *things* in earth, and *things* under the earth;

### a. 3 spheres

- i. **Romans 10:6-7** <sup>6</sup>But the righteousness which is of faith speaketh on this wise, Say not in thine heart, Who shall ascend into heaven? (that is, to bring Christ down *from above*:) <sup>7</sup>Or, Who shall descend into the deep? (that is, to bring up Christ again from the dead.)
- ii. **Ephesians 4:8-10** <sup>8</sup>Wherefore he saith, When he ascended up on high, he led captivity captive, and gave gifts unto men. <sup>9</sup>(Now that he ascended, what is it but that he also descended first into the lower parts of the earth? <sup>10</sup>He that descended is the same also that ascended up far above all heavens, that he might fill all things.)
  - 1. Even angelic
  - 2. **Hebrews 1:6** <sup>6</sup>And again, when he bringeth in the firstbegotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him.
- iii. **Revelation 5:13** <sup>13</sup> And every creature which is in heaven, and on the earth, and under the earth, and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them, heard I saying, Blessing, and honour, and glory, and power, *be* unto him that sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb for ever and ever.

# b. Bowing even in judgment

- i. Romans 2:16 <sup>16</sup>In the day when God shall judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ according to my gospel.
- VIII. **Philippians 2:11** And *that* every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ *is* Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
  - a. Jesus= Jehovah saves
  - b. Christ= Messiah anointed
  - c. Lord= Kurios= master

- i. Acts 4:10-12 <sup>10</sup>Be it known unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, *even* by him doth this man stand here before you whole. <sup>11</sup>This is the stone which was set at nought of you builders, which is become the head of the corner. <sup>12</sup>Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved
- d. **Revelation 20:11-13** <sup>11</sup>And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them. <sup>12</sup>And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is *the book* of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works. <sup>13</sup>And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works.
