

### FROM THE PASTOR

The Mission Field.

"As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him" (MT 4:18-19, NIV).

Jesus entered the everyday of the disciple's life and offered them a single command, "Come, follow me." We have heard this story and others like it many times before. In response, we might nod our heads in agreement and offer an 'Amen.' But like many churches across this nation, we may have followed Jesus with our eyes instead of our lives.

The Lord is moving in many hearts. Many feel the 'tug' of following but lack the guidance or sense of direction of where to go. Many of your brothers and sisters in this very church are witnessing the Holy Spirit push them to actively "Follow Christ."

On Saturday, May 3, recent ILI Participants were invited to coffee and donuts with Pastor Ray to discuss what we learned from the ILI training. Eight attendees shared their thoughts on the information provided and the many witnesses they experienced. The following points were presented to the Ad Council on 5/27/25 as necessary guidance.

- 1) What is our mission? If the church is not driven by its mission and powered by the Holy Spirit, then it is just a country club.
- 2) Each gathering should fulfill some part of our mission, and it should begin with prayer for the presence of the Holy Spirit. Our goal is not to fill the church, please ourselves, or follow tradition, but to win souls for Christ.
- 3) We need a 4-pronged approach to reach these varied groups: The unchurched. Those who used to attend. Those who just sit in church. Everyone else.

- 4) Pastor Ray will be teaching to the ILI Core Values from the pulpit beginning in September. He will encourage Sunday Schools to also cover aspects of the core values as he teaches them to further reinforce the message.
- 5) We need to prepare ourselves from within the church to reach outside the church. Pastor Ray intends to build a prayer team to go into the community. The goal will be personal one-to-one interaction to reach those not in God's Army.

None of these ideas are new. Many we can point to in our recent past. What is new is the realization that we have slowed or ceased in some capacity. I am asking each group; each Sunday School, committee, Bible study, fellowship event, or frequent gathering of two or more people consider these five-steps. Let them be the first and last thing we speak of when we gather in any way.

I thank you all for what you have done, are doing, and will do to the service and honor of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. May His name be praised!


