<p>Here are some ways to focus on putting others first at home this month.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Place a basket in your kitchen or on the dinner table. Drop in any change or collect an offering. Support Tennessee Flood relief by visiting the following website and contribute. You can contribute online or send a check. https://tndisasterrelief.org/contributions/ Snacking around: Ask kids to pick an extra box of their favorite snack at the grocery store to send to school for teachers to use when classmates don't have snack or money to purchase snacks. Rockin a kind Word: Help kids decorate a cool rock. Let your kids write a compliment or a word of encouragement on the rock with a permanent maker and then leave it behind in a park, restaurant etc. If possible add a favorite scripture verse as well! 	<p>For September we will observe an annual ministry opportunity called Christmas Backpacks. These backpacks will be distributed through the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board. Please look at the back of this sheet for instructions on how to collect and label your backpack with ribbons. - **Children's or Teen Bible**
- **The Christmas Story (will be mailed to registering organizations)**
- **2 ribbons** to indicate gender and age of recipient.
- The 2 ribbons should be tied securely to the backpack. (see the KEY below)

Please pack backpacks according to the guidelines below.

Christmas Story (will be mailed to registering organizations)
Always include a copy of the Christmas Story

TOYS (At least 1 item): Small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, sidewalk chalk, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, Frisbee, card games such as Ol' Maid, Go Fish, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS (At least 2 items): toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (boxed and in a plastic bag), shampoo (securely sealed & in a plastic bag) hairbrush, comb, pony tail holders, barrettes, hair clips, washcloth, etc.

OTHER (At least 2 items): age-appropriate Christian books, sunglasses, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

FOOD (At least 2 items): Canned food items with pop-tops (nothing which requires a can opener and no plastic containers), protein bars, hard candy (NO chocolate) and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum,

NO food items with peanut butter or nuts).

CLOTHING (At least 2 items. All clothing items must be new with tags/packaging): T-shirts, underwear, socks, warm hat, gloves, scarf, ball cap, fleece pullover, warm outerwear

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: School supplies are welcome, but not all sites need school supplies. If you are partnering with a site, please check with them regarding school supplies and what type of school supplies are needed, Please use age-appropriate school supplies.

Additional Ideas to consider for older kids (11-17):

GIRLS: lip gloss, costume jewelry, scarves, friendship bracelets, craft kits, journals, fun socks & slippers, doodle books, Spirograph kit, feminine hygiene supplies

BOYS: LEGOS®, card games, hand-held electronic games, flashlights (with extra batteries), basketball, soccer ball, NERF™ football **Please do not include any food items that are perishable or can be easily crushed or opened while in transit. Please do not include any knives.**
