

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

In order to provide a safe (as possible) environment, IRPC will be adhering to the following required and recommended protocols for all worship services. The protocols listed below will be standard practice until further notice.

- Masks / face coverings will be required for admittance, this as required by St. Lucie County. PLEASE BRING A MASK WITH YOU. There is only a limited supply available for those who seek admittance without a mask.
- Temperatures will be taken at the door. Persons with a temperature of 100-degrees or more will not be admitted. The CDC guideline is 100.4-degrees. If you are not feeling well, please stay home. You can still watch the 9:30 am worship service via live stream at www.irpcfamly.org. A video of each week's sermon message will also be posted on the IRPC website.
- In order to social distance (6-feet apart per CDC guidelines), the first 110 persons at any one worship serve will be admitted into the Sanctuary. This number may vary depending on the spacing of persons in attendance. Those seeking admittance after this capacity has been reached will be directed to Sample Hall where a live feed will be available for both the worship services.
- (NEW) Those attending the 9:30 am worship service, you are asked to exit the doors at the back of the Sanctuary that face the southwest-25th Street side of the property and not exit through the church hallway. This will help accommodate the efforts to sanitize the Sanctuary prior to the 11:00 am service and the 6-foot social distancing guidelines.
- (NEW) Those attending the 11:00 am worship service, you are asked not to arrive prior to 10:45 am in order to give sufficient time to properly sanitize the Sanctuary following the 9:30 am service. It will also help with 6-foot social distancing guidelines.
- (NEW) IRPC will follow best practices when contact tracing is necessary. Should it come to our attention that someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 has attended a worship service, IRPC Staff will reach out to those who attended the service to apprise them of their potential exposure. Because of privacy regulations, the names of the persons will not be revealed. Those who were in close proximity will be encouraged to get tested and consult their primary care physician.
