

**Paralytic Healed – Parallel Verses Matthew 9:1-8, Mark 2:1-12, and Luke 5:17-26**

Matthew 9	Mark 2	Luke 5
1 So He got into a boat, crossed over, and came to His own city.	1 And again He entered <b>Capernaum</b> after <i>some</i> days, and it was heard that He was in the house. 2 Immediately many gathered together, so that there was no longer room to receive <i>them</i> , not even near the door. And He preached the word to them.	17 Now it happened on a certain day, as He was teaching, that there were Pharisees and teachers of the law sitting by, who had come out of every town of Galilee, Judea, and Jerusalem. And the power of the Lord was <i>present</i> to heal them.
2 Then behold, they brought to Him a paralytic lying on a bed.	3 Then they came to Him, bringing a paralytic who was carried by four <i>men</i> . 4 And when they could not come near Him because of the crowd, they uncovered the roof where He was. So when they had broken through, they let down the bed on which the paralytic was lying.	18 Then behold, men brought on a bed a man who was paralyzed, whom they sought to bring in and lay before Him. 19 And when they could not find how they might bring him in, because of the crowd, they went up on the housetop and let him down with his bed through the tiling into the midst before Jesus.

3 And at once some of the <b>scribes</b> said within themselves, “This Man blasphemes!”	6 And some of the <b>scribes</b> were sitting there and reasoning in their hearts, <sup>7</sup> “Why does this <i>Man</i> speak blasphemies like this? <b>Who can forgive sins but God alone?”</b>	21 And the <b>scribes and the Pharisees</b> began to reason, saying, “Who is this who speaks blasphemies? <b>Who can forgive sins but God alone?”</b>
4 But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, “Why do you think evil in your hearts?”	8 But immediately, when Jesus perceived in His spirit that they reasoned thus within themselves, He said to them, “Why do you reason about these things in your hearts?”	22 But when Jesus perceived their thoughts, He answered and said to them, “Why are you reasoning in your hearts?”
5 For which is easier, to say, “Your sins are forgiven you,” or to say, ‘Arise and walk’?	9 Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, “Your sins are forgiven you,” or to say, ‘Arise, take up your bed and walk’?	23 Which is easier, to say, “Your sins are forgiven you,’ or to say, ‘Rise up and walk’?

7 And he arose and departed to his house.	12 Immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went out in the presence of them all,	25 Immediately he rose up before them, took up what he had been lying on, and departed to his own house, glorifying God.
8 Now when the multitudes saw <i>it</i> , they marveled and glorified God, who had given such power to men.	so that all were amazed and glorified God, saying, “We never saw <i>anything</i> like this!”	26 And they were all amazed, and they glorified God and were filled with fear, saying, “We have seen strange things today!”
