My Dear Praying Friends,

Finally, the year 2020 is nearing its end having entered the history as one of the worst years in decades. However, there is no guarantee year 2021 will be any better. In fact, the dreadful time the Bible calls "tribulation" is inevitably coming and we find ourselves in the last of days before it hits. We always said it, but seems like we will start experiencing living in such "last days" more and more with each passing year things are not going to get better, I don't think, they are only going to get worse before the Lord comes to take His church in the Rapture. I am not a prophet or a son of a prophet and hate to make such dreary predictions but I really think we all need to adjust our lives to a new reality and readjust our ministries accordingly. I don't have all the answers and still working on new ministry strategy should the year 2021 be the same as 2020, if not worse. Because, and I must be frank with you, we have not accomplished 50% of all the ministry plans we had for this past year and I surely don't want to make new plans for the upcoming year without the assumption it will be as bad as 2020 in this regard. Yes, we kept our personal walk with the Lord (Bible reading, prayer life), we kept Menorah Baptist Church going and somewhat growing, gospel tract distribution, personal Jewish and gentle witness, preaching and teaching, etc., these things were all present. What we did not have, mass meetings, evangelization in cities and villages, domestic and international travel, but most importantly people attending any events. If the access to the main emphasis of our ministry, that's the people, is denied due to global and local quarantines, various fears, restrictions, etc., then we are really limited in what we can do. I ask you to please **join my family in prayer as to a new ministry strategy for the year 2021 and I hope to be able to share with you some of the future ministry plans in our Christmas prayer letter next month. Thank you!**

Back in October my son Nikita and I as a part of a group of ten travelled to the military zone with our usual mission of bringing humanitarian aid and the Gospel to the Ukrainian soldiers at the front lines. The first day went fine but on the second day due to some headquarters error, we were denied access to the military base where the most soldiers were gathered waiting on us. In one of the pictures you may see me witnessing to a stoic looking officer, and he heard a lot of things from me that day he has not heard before, which he admitted he had a lot of food for thought now. We always bring much reading material and Bibles for these men and are always eager to go back again and again as the Lord allows! **Thank you for your prayers for our safety and eternity results as we go. We are aiming to go again in January 21'.**



While the days were warm, and an Indian Summer in Ukraine is always beautiful, we were able to remain on the streets with the gospel tracts and a witness. It really is exciting and adventurous, at least I take it that way, to embark on a day's journey, having prayed in the morning for souls to meet and save, and venture out into the unknown, roaming the streets, talking to people, distributing God's Word, drinking occasional coffee and a sandwich, and just go on marveling at how God shapes your day with events and people. Occasionally I may pray with someone for their needs right there in the street and a couple would pray a sinner's prayer with me, these interactions to me is the essence of a missionary work (Rom. 10:15) and I am grateful for God using me in this simple way searching for lost souls, Jews and gentiles, and directing them on the only way in truth to life who is Jesus Christ! Amen!

Menorah Baptist Church is doing fine. Despite the quarantine our attendance is stable around 20 people. We air our services online every Sunday and archive them for a later use. Not many new first-time visitors came these months but the new additions I mentioned in my previous prayer letter are attending faithfully and will be baptized.
