LIBRARY NEWS



THE FLORENCE LEGACY by Lauraine Snelling. In bestselling author Lauraine Snelling's latest novel packed with friendship, grief, and travel gone awry, three friends take their dream trip to Florence, Italy, in memory of a beloved woman who has passed away. As the last will of a close friend is read, three women who discover that they have inherited a legacy from her: the funds to take a dream trip to Florence, Italy. In her memory. With plenty of hilarious travel mishaps along the way, this book is a story of deep friendship, of making room in our lives for celebration and remembering and of the sweetness of unexpected romance.

A PROMISE KEPT by Jo Ann Brown. A Powerful sensation rushed through Dinah when she saw the other buggy leave. Disappointment. She shook her head. She was acting silly. She'd exchanged no more than a handful of words with Aaron Smucker. So why was she disappointed to see that he was gone? She didn't know, but she did know she didn't have time for a relationship now. Not even a man whose glance in her direction had made her heart thud against her ribs could be allowed to distract her from the vow she'd made to Daed. Dinah Lanz and Aaron Smucker have one thing in common. They always put family first. After his older brother's wife died, Aaron accompanied Titus and his young son to Pennsylvania, hoping they could start a shed-building business and get a fresh start. Dinah promised her father on his deathbed she would take care of them, not knowing how hard that would be or how it would get in the way of her building a family of her own. But she's determined to keep her promise.

LIVEMARK by Chris Fabry. For eighteen years, she's tried to believe she made the right decision--for him. But if she never sees him again, how can she ever be sure? Melissa has clung to the thin thread of hope given by the adoption agency that someday her newborn son might want to connect with her. When his eighteenth birthday arrives, she calls the agency to simply update her contact information, not expecting a response. Susan and Jimmy Colton have raised their boy with openness about his adoption. After the heartbreaking loss of two infant sons that marked their early years of marriage, they promised themselves they would try not to hold too tightly to David or hold back any information he wanted about his birth. And so they've waited on him. David has been hesitant to discuss the questions and curiosities about his birth story that often haunt him. But as he nears adulthood, his need to know the full story of his life becomes something he can't shake. Until the call from the adoption agency comes to the Coltons, and the first tentative bits of communication and connection set in motion a story that will change all their lives forever.

NEXT DOOR SAVIOR by Max Lucado. Jesus. Holy or human? According to the bible he was--and is--both. Fully God and fully man. Our next door Savior. The Christ of your galaxies is the Christ of your Mondays. The Starmaker manages your travel schedule. Relax. You have a friend in high places. The universe's Commander in Chief knows your name. He has walked your streets. Endowed with sleepless attention and endless devotion, he listens. The fact that we can't imagine how he hears a million requests as if they were only one doesn't mean he can't or doesn't. For he can and does. There is no person he won't touch. No place he won't go to find you. For even though he is in heaven, he never left the neighborhood.


