

Weekly Devotion By Pastor Dennis

Proverbs 14:23 "All hard work brings a profit, but mere talk leads only to poverty."

Before Theodore Roosevelt became President, he was an avid sportsman and hunter. However, few people were aware of his efforts for conservation. After a hunting trip to the Dakotas in 1887, he returned to his East Coast home concerned that trees were being cut down carelessly, animals were being slaughtered by "game-butchers," and the grasslands were becoming a desert.

Mr. Roosevelt did more than talk. He founded the Boone & Crocket Club, dedicated to the preservation of wilderness in America. Largely through that club's influence, legislation was passed to protect Yellowstone National Park and the sequoia trees in California. It also served to regulate hunting practices.

Our faith and our family standards deserve the same efforts and protection. In the book of James chapter 2 vs.14, James asked...... "What good is it my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds?"

When Jesus was crucified, He left His Church in the hands of His apostles. It was up to them to share the Good News of Jesus Christ a world which was greatly influenced by a legalistic Sanhedrin. For their efforts, every apostle except one (John) was killed.

Fortunately, Christians today do not have to fear such persecution. Yet, the responsibility of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ is still ours.

What We Should Know

The Christian Church today is in serious decline and, without our efforts, it will continue on that "slippery slope." Let us work together. Participate in small groups and studies. Invite people to church. Tithe and give to build the ministry. Let's do all we can to build the kingdom. Hoping for change rarely brings about change. Work, however, generally does!
