From Tom's Study

"In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." – Luke 2:8-11 (The NRSV)

Through the season of Advent we are focusing our attention on different characters from the Christmas story. We start with Zechariah, Elizabeth and John, then Mary, then Joseph and finally the Shepherds. As we make our way through Advent I would encourage us to take some quiet time and reflect upon these different people and their Advent experiences. Put yourselves in the shoes of these different people. How would you have responded to the different encounters had with Angels and the Spirit of God?

The common response we hear about is fear even terror. We see that in the passage above where the shepherds, going about their daily work were terrified by the arrival of the angel. I think for us, in our day, this idea of terror conjures up images of horror movies. I think, perhaps, for our context a better word than "fear" or "terror" would be "awe". The shepherds' nightly routine was interrupted by overwhelming awe. When has your life routine been interrupted by "awe"?

The angel responded to the shepherds' reaction by saying, "Do not be afraid." Perhaps a better translation would be, "Do not be paralyzed."

God never wants our response to encountering the Holy to be paralysis. This is another important consideration for our Advent journey. So often, when it comes to "God Topics, or God Ideas, or Responding to God" we find ourselves paralyzed. Paralysis is the last thing God hopes from us, or for us. God hopes we respond to our Divine encounters with transformation and action, not with paralysis.

Next the angel said, "I bring you good news of great joy for all people, a Savior, the Messiah, the Lord has come to you." God hopes that our encounters with the Holy, with God breaking into our lives, bring great joy, and an assurance of inclusion. Is that our hope too? Is that our belief about the nature of our God? Encounters with God should assure us of being included and bring us great joy, but is that where our hearts and minds go in relation to God?

As we spend time with the characters of the Christmas story, like the shepherds, what does it mean to put on their shoes and know the "awe" of being in God's presence? May each of us open ourselves to the "awe" of God encounters, but let us not be paralyzed, instead let us move to response and action. Let each of us draw near to God as we make our Advent journey.

Sermon Title: "Hope and Joy for the Shepherds"

Synopsis: For many of us the shepherds are perhaps our favorite part of the Christmas story. What about the situation experienced by the shepherds resonates with your life? How did the shepherd's experience turn into hope and joy?

December 24 - Christmas Eve

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 9:2-7, Psalm 96, Luke 2:1-20, Titus 2:11-14

Sermon Title: "Freedom to Live Differently"

Synopsis: When we know that God's saving grace has been poured out on our behalf, does that knowledge give us the freedom to live differently? If so, how should we live out that freedom?

December 27 – 1st Sunday after Christmas

Scripture Reading: Luke 2:21-40, Psalm 111

Sermon Title: "The Wonderful Works of God"

Synopsis: As we begin a New Year, let us take a bit of time to reflect on how we have been blessed by God's faithfulness. How have you experienced the faithfulness of God in your life?
