

Sunday School Teacher

Sunday school teachers at First Presbyterian Church have one of the most important roles in the entire church! Sunday school teachers are on the front lines as we teach children about God's love for them in a safe, fun, and loving environment. Everything we do should reflect God's love and welcome to us all.

What you do

Alongside a Sunday school helper/partner, engage children in Kindergarten – 4th grade with the provided Sunday school curriculum during either the 10:00 a.m. or 5:00 p.m. worship service.

Meet children in the back of the sanctuary following the children's message to lead them to Sunday school.

Love and enjoy the kids who are there!

Tidy up the Sunday school room at the end of your time, putting away any supplies and cleaning off tables if necessary.

Attend Sunday school team meetings (approximately 3x a year).

Time commitment

Ideally a once-a-month commitment to help kids develop relationship with adults in the congregation.

Time during the week (on your own) to go over the lesson and make sure you have any necessary materials. Lesson materials can be accessed online so you can review it from home.

On Sundays: Teachers arrive at least 15 minutes before worship begins to make sure everything is set up as needed and to gather any supplies, meet children in the sanctuary, and remain in the Sunday school room until all kids have been picked up by parents.
